This week I'd like to remind all of our students and parents how important it is to use our school crossing if you are crossing Armstrong street down near Croudace Street. This crossing is a part-time crossings that operate before and after school hours. Aside from these times, the area is not a pedestrian crossing. When in use, red flags displaying the words CHILDREN CROSSING are used. Drivers must slow down and halt before the stop line when a pedestrian is on the crossing or waiting to cross – and remain stopped until all pedestrians leave the crossing.



The Centre for Road Safety Transport NSW advices drivers to;

- Slow down on roads where there are likely to be a lot of pedestrians, especially near schools
- Be aware that pedestrians are hard to see in poor weather
- $\,\blacksquare\,$ Don't assume that a pedestrian has seen you and will wait for you to go past
- Be mindful that vulnerable pedestrians may need extra time to cross children can be difficult to see and may act unpredictably

Student Leadership for 2019

Lambton Public School Student Leadership for 2019



At Lambton Public School we provide many opportunities for our students to hold positions of leadership within the school. Student leadership positions are held in high esteem by the Principal, staff, fellow students, parents, carers and the general community. Each year, positions are available for students to apply for are:

- Two School Captains
- Two Vice Captains
- Four School Prefects
- Year 6 monitor positions such as: Sound monitors, Quiet space leaders, Photographers, Lab Monitors and Recycling Monitors.

There are many traits a student leader requires and certain specific criteria students must meet in order to be considered for a position.

Student Leadership Criteria:

- 1. Demonstrates leadership qualities both in current and in previous years.
- 2. Demonstrates continuous effort in seeking to do one's very best.
- 3. Consistently demonstrates competence, perseverance and resilience.
- 4. Consistently demonstrates an understanding of, and a caring attitude towards, fellow students and younger students.
- 5. Consistently wears our LPS uniform with pride.
- 6. Consistently supports and demonstrates the LPS School Values; and is a positive example of these behaviours to peers.
- 7. Demonstrates collaborative team skills in working both with staff and students.
- 8. Demonstrates involvement in a range of school and extra-curricular activities.
- 9. Demonstrates competent public speaking skills in both formal and informal contexts.
- 10. It will be seen to be a very significant advantage as an applicant if a student has previously held a leadership position such as: a co-leader in Peer Support or student council representative. Similarly, involvement in teams such as the school band, Starstruck dance, School Choir and involvement in teams representing our school will be advantageous

Guidelines

School Captain & Prefect Nomination Process

<u>Step 1:</u> Year 5 students are invited to apply for a School Leadership position by submitting a written application. Applicants must <u>write a sentence of evidence addressing each of the leadership criteria</u> on page 1. All applications must be handed to Miss Soley or Mrs Lantz by the due date: <u>Wednesday 7th November.</u>

Step 2: On Thursday 8th November a lunchtime speech writing workshop will run to support the students who present an application.

Step 3: On Wednesday 14th November nominees will deliver a 2 minute speech to Miss Soley, Mrs Lantz and a Stage 3 teacher during lunchtime.

<u>Step 4:</u> A list of candidates will be selected from this process and these students will prepare a speech to deliver to the whole school on <u>Wednesday 21st November at 9.30am</u>. Following this, a vote will take place by the students & staff to decide the 2 captains, 2 vice captains and 4 prefects.

<u>Step 5:</u> The successful & unsuccessful candidates will be informed verbally and a note will go home to inform parents of the decision <u>by Wednesday 28th</u> November.

Step 6: The names of the Captains, Vice Captains and Prefects will be announced on the Wednesday 12th December at Presentation Day.

Students should include the following in their speech:

- Discuss previous roles of responsibility they have held e.g. SRC, Starstruck dance, Starstruck choir, debating team member, Peer Support Co-leader, school band member, multi-cultural group member and any other contributions to representing our school.
- Give examples of how you demonstrate the school values of Respect, Responsibility and Personal Best in your daily life. Include qualities you possess that would make you a successful leader at Lambton Public School.
- Make your speech entertaining by including humour, a jingle, a sign or poster, or anything else that makes your speech memorable.

Considerations:

- Students are encouraged to discuss the criteria with parents & caregivers for guidance. Although we expect to see it written in their own words.
- If any students experience difficulty please approach your classroom teacher for assistance.
- Please ensure that no campaigning occurs if your child becomes a candidate, this again is to ensure equity in the process.
- Ensure speeches are written by students not by adults for equity reasons.

Year 6 Monitors: i.e. Quiet space leaders, lab monitors, recycling monitors, photographers and Sound monitors

Students interested in a monitoring position are asked to hand in a written application based on the leadership criteria on page 1. Just 1 sentence per criteria is expected. All applications must be handed to the Stage 3 teachers by <u>Thursday 22nd November</u>. Selections will be made by the Stage 3 Teachers and Mrs Saunders our Principal based on how strongly students have met the criteria.

We thank you for your support in this process. These leadership positions require students to work hard and show resilience and perseverance as role models of our school. The process of selection is to ensure complete transparency and to provide a fair and equal playing field for all students wishing to nominate themselves.

Sports House Captains:

Sports house captains and vice captains are voted on in house meetings at the beginning of the school year. The leadership criteria will be used as a guide for the students during this process in term 1, 2019.

Students will be given the opportunity to hold only 1 leadership role so that the roles can be shared around to as many students as possible. If students are needed to fill more than 1 position this will be considered.

Senior Disco (Year 3 to Year 6) - 6.15pm to 8.00pm 12 - 14 Volunteers


Pack Up 8.00pm to 8.30pm 2 - 4 Volunteers Needed
